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OUR CRITICS ON
SHORTAGE OF COTTON.

JN our issue of July 1, we outlined what seemed to us the best, surest and quickest scheme of getting Raw Cotton grown in Nigeria upon such an extensive scale as in the U. S. America. But the method advocated by us does not appear to have commended itself to certain people who are interested in the cotton industry. Among them is a correspondent who signed himself "Stephen" in our issue of the 22/9 July who quoted in support of his contention from a paper read before the Empire Textile Conference at Wembley last June by Mr. W. H. Hembury, the General Manager of the British Cotton Growing Association. "Mr. Stephen" could not see anything in our suggestions but "unemployment problem."

There is a vast difference between "a number of Model Cotton Farms to be located in every District in the Northern Provinces to be worked entirely by Negro Cotton Labourers and Farmers specially imported on contract" and "various Model Cotton Farms within the various cotton centre in the Northern Nigeria." The plea of "adding considerably to our unemployment problem" cannot hold water in this case as there is not such a thing as unemployment in the Northern Provinces, the area of which is sparsely populated—being 35.65 to the square mile in comparison with our 98.34 in the Southern Provinces.

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E fi owo ati Letter ranse si Editor.

It is to the "North" that all our unemployed youngmen often betook themselves as a last resort—knowing that work is certain in any part of those regions, where the demand for workers by far exceeds the supply.

It is an open secret that clerks from the Southern Provinces often move heaven and earth by their supplications and petitions to get themselves transferred back from the Northern Provinces at the least opportunity, owing to the conditions prevailing in that portion of Nigeria.

It is true some students are now under training at the Moor Plantation as Cotton Inspectors. Can "Mr. Stephen" tell us how many of those youngmen after completing their courses will be able to stay and do useful work in the Northern Provinces? Who then, will be the pioneers and instructors of the indigenous inhabitants in the modern methods of scientific farming that has enabled the U. S. A. to produce such huge quantities of cotton by which they now hold the first place in all the cotton markets of the world?

Of what use is the production of 25,000 bales in ten years to Lancashire Cotton Mills by the side of 30,000,000 bales annually shipped to Great Britain from the U. S. A.? We know for certain that this quantity of cotton will not continue to reach the British Cotton Weavers and the quantity can be produced easily in Nigeria alone. At the present rate of production, Nigeria will require at least 30 years more to reach this figure. Meanwhile, the interest of British Cotton Weavers and the Empire Cotton Industry would have suffered irreparably through the loss of their control of the world's best cotton markets.

The Empire's immediate need is cotton grown within her borders. We believe the same labour used in the

U.S.A. could be easily and profitably employed to produce the required quantity of cotton in Nigeria within the next 8 years.

We should not allow self-interest to blind us to the greater interests of our country and the Empire at large. The bitter lessons of our Rubber Industry should not be lost on us. It was simply the result of making use of indigenous collectors instead of experts when introducing the industry into the country.

Once an industry is correctly taught our people, the rest will be easy. The Cacao Industry is an object lesson and an ocular demonstration of what our people are capable of doing when rightly taught. We should discourage wrong methods of producing any commodity in Nigeria for exportation to Great Britain and Continental countries. We should see to it that none but experts are sent to teach the Farmers the right methods of preparation.

It will be news to "Mr. Stephen" to be told that the success of the re-introduction of Cotton growing for exportation in Nigeria is due to the two American Negro-Cotton experts—who were university professors—especially engaged from U.S.A. by the B.C.G.A. to start the Company's Farms and Ginneries in Southern Nigeria, and whatever the Association has been able to do in this portion of the Empire is largely due to the labours of these two experts from America,—in selecting the right kind of soil, seed and machinery and also in getting the people interested in the industry.

We are confident that this scheme is sure of yielding good results within a few years if adopted. The gain to our own people from their contact with up-to-date implements will be incalculable.
